

* Buckle Them In, * Then Bundle Them Up!

CAR SEAT SAFETY WINTER TIPS

Bulky winter coats should NOT be worn in a car seat.

The extra coat padding makes it hard to get the harness to fit correctly.

The harness might feel snug, but the extra material will compress in a crash, making the harness too loose. Loose harness straps means your child will not be safe in a crash.



No coat with warm layers, like a light weight fleece. Warm your car ahead of time when possible.



No coat with a blanket added after buckling up, or put the coat on backwards over the harness.



A bulky coat will make the seat harness fit incorrectly, which can cause injury or ejection in a car crash.

Check if your child's coat is safe to wear in the car seat:

- 1. Put the coat on your child, sit them in the car seat, then buckle and tighten the harness.
 - 2. Without loosening the harness, unbuckle it and remove your child from the seat.
 - 3. Take the coat off your child, then strap them back into the car seat.
 - 4. Without adjusting the straps, check the harness. If it's too loose, the coat is too thick to wear in the car seat.
